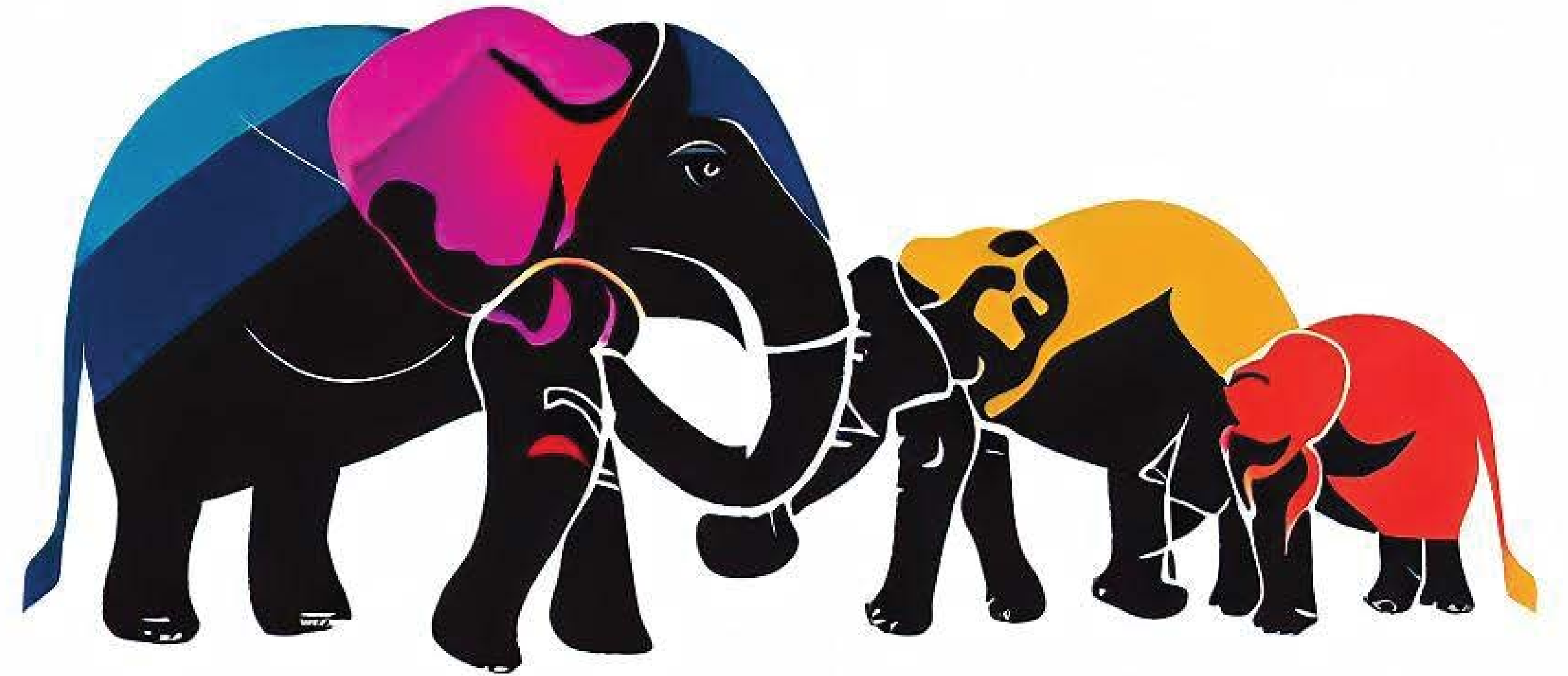
Threats to Elephants (Threatened Species)

- Elephants are threatened, which means there aren't many left in the wild.
- Nigeria is home to two different species of elephants: the African Savanna Elephant found in Yankari Game Reserve, Bauchi State, and the African Forest Elephant found in Omo Forest Reserve, Ogun State, Nigeria.
- The African forest elephant is now listed as Critically Endangered, and the African savanna elephant (*Loxodonta africana*) as Endangered on the IUCN Red List of

Get Creative: Elephant Art and Crafts!

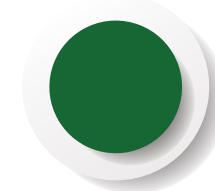
- Let's have fun while learning about elephants! You can create your own elephant-themed artwork using paints, clay, or even recycled materials.

- Your creativity can help raise awareness about elephant conservation in a unique way!



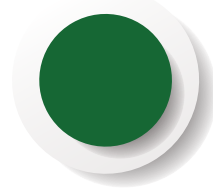

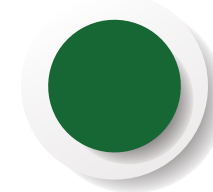
Become an Elephant Guardian!

- Let's celebrate these magnificent creatures and pledge to protect them for generations to come.

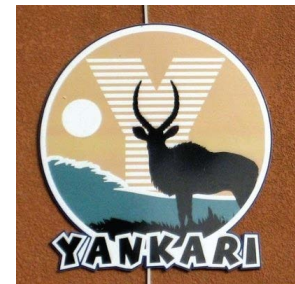
